

C. E. Reichenbach, At Work On Burial Plot, Falls Dead

Charles Edwin Reichenbach, 62, Port Trevorton R. D. 1, died suddenly Saturday at 11 a. m. of a heart attack. Mr. Reichenbach was engaged in cleaning the cemetery near Lower Herrold's School. The cemetery contains bodies of Revolutionary War veterans and Mr. Reichenbach made it a practice to clean the grounds each summer. Death apparently was instant.

Mr. Reichenbach, a veteran of World War I, was born November 24, 1891, the son of William and Mary Eckard Reichenbach. He was a member of the Port Trevorton Evangelical United Brethren church, and a member of American Legion Victory Post 25, Selinsgrove.

Mr. Reichenbach had worked for many years in the unemployment office in Harrisburg.

Surviving are his wife, Ada Reichenbach; two brother, David, of Wilkes-Barre, and Millard, of Matheim; two sisters, Elizabeth and Laura Reichenbach, of Port Trevorton R. D. 1, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 p. m. from St. John's Evangelical United Brethren church, Chapman. Rev. J. C. Moses will officiate. Interment will be in the church cemetery. Viewing will be held tonight at Flanders funeral home, Port Trevorton.
